Finally the first two noticed this and went after the leader. Then the luffing match started again with all three of them in it this time. They finally wound up by all three tacking down wind to the leeward mark! Then Ruth Becker got a good lead and it was all over. She was finally declared the winner and later received the trophy. Only one race was held.

Two races were held for the Junior National Championship and the Valspar Trophy. Both were on August 29, in the morning, with plenty of wind, but not as much as came in later in the afternoon. Ken Heitman from Lake Mohawk, New Jersey, sailed Blondie to win the first race but came in third in the second race. Toni Koult of the Newport Yacht Club was first in the second race but got a fourth in the first race. As a result, Ken was declared the winner. Twelve boats started in the first race and ten in the second.

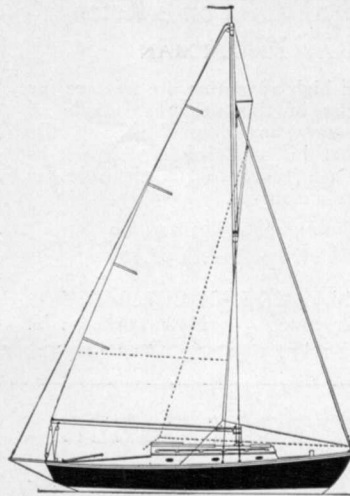

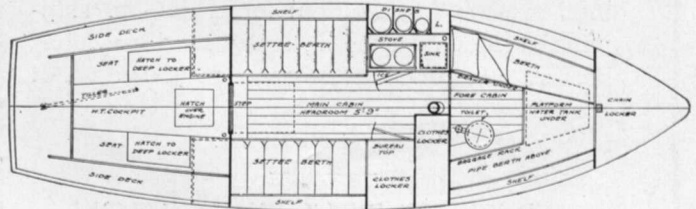
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
